The Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies, University of Edinburgh, wishes to appoint a full-time Lecturer or Senior Lecturer in Veterinary Clinical Pathology. This position is an exciting opportunity to join a vibrant and international team and to contribute to the further development of the diagnostic pathology service, teaching of pathology, and the School's research programme.

This Lecturer position at the RDSVS offers (reward calculator; staff benefits):

- 8 working weeks paid holiday per year and <u>family friendly initiatives</u> (including up to 1 year maternity leave)
- Regular 9 5 schedule with possibility for hybrid work when not on duty and diverse daily work

Covering all aspects of clinical pathology, though mainly haematology and cytology, the successful candidate will play an important role in the diagnostic work of Easter Bush Pathology. They will contribute in the delivery and assessment of the BVM&S undergraduate teaching programme, of

eLearning and on-line teaching initiatives, and to contribute to the training of residents in clinical pathology and of other disciplines. Finally the post holder will be able to make a significant contribution to research within the School, the Roslin institute, and the wider Centre for Comparative Pathology depending on their interests.

You will be based in the new Veterinary School building, opened in 2011 in the Easter Bush Campus, ideally located at the foot of the gorgeous Pentland hills. Interaction with colleagues across the range of disciplines will offer you the stimulation and support required to further develop your interests and career ambitions.

You will hold a veterinary degree and will be an MRCVS (or eligible to become an MRCVS). You will be qualified in veterinary clinical pathology to diploma level (e.g. DipECVCP, DipACVP (Clin Path) or FRCPath), although Board-eligible candidates are also encouraged to apply. Practical experience in the delivery of a diagnostic clinical pathology service is essential. Experience in teaching and research are strongly desirable.
